Cycle training delivery in **2024-25**



Bikeability Scotland is the national cycle training programme for school children. Delivered by trained instructors, it helps children build the skills and confidence they need to cycle on today's roads.



Half of all local authorities now deliver on-road cycle training in over **90%** of their primary schools



Two thirds of primary schools delivered Bikeability Scotland training – benefiting **53,570** young people



62% of primary schools offered on-road (Level 2) cycle training



A **record number** of Scottish councils (14) delivered on-road cycle training at every primary school in their area

More than **500,000** young people have completed Bikeability Scotland training since it began in 2011
